### Restoration Tip

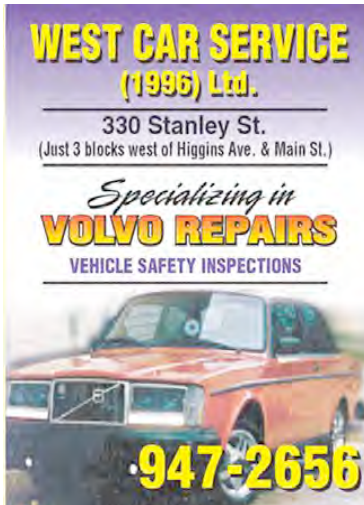
Recently I was helping Graeme Lowden with the trafficator for his BT7 as he was replacing the wiring and I had just done one a few days before in one of the restoration project I am working on. All went well until I went to attach the wiring harness to the back of the trafficator. The colour tracers on the loom he brought were not of the same colour as original. Graeme told me that he obtained his wiring loom from Moss Motors while the one I had recently done was from British Wiring and was correct. So I contacted Moss Motors and while they were helpful in sorting out this problem, I wondered why they would sell harnesses that do not match the original wiring loom.

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Later, I discussed this problem with Roger Morcilla who also had installed a new wiring loom in his BT7 and he mentioned that he had faced the same problem. So if anyone plans to replace their trafficator with a Moss one, here is the order on how to do it.

On an original wiring loom for the trafficator, when viewed from the back, going from left to right; the left wire is green/yellow, the next one is green, next one is green/blue and the last one is brown.

On the Moss one, so it works properly with your signal lights, horns etc., you must wire it as follows; left wire is green/white, next one is green/brown, next one is green/red and the last one is brown/black.
